

John Young Hall of | Australian Fame - Frank Soars 21st inductee





Frank Soars the 21st Inductee to the John Young Hall of Fame - His award was accepted by his son Patrick Soars

The legendary Frank Soars joined Manly Vale in 1956 and later went to Harbord before settling at Mona Vale. The first bowler from Mona Vale to be selected for NSW, Frank was considered the best player produced on the Northern Beaches.In discussions as to "best bowler NEVER to represent Australia" Frank's name was always to the fore.

The late Bowls Australian representative and BA Hall of Famer Ken Woods quoted in 2011, "Frank was the best bowler I ever played against".

A Rat of Tobruk in World War II, Frank suffered with health problems which curtailed his career significantly.

A man with an incredibly sharp wit, a booming voice and a very quick delivery, Frank Soars was one of those irreplaceable characters of our game.

Indoor Singles

Bowls NSW is pleased to announce that there will be four venues for Australian Indoor Singles Qualifying for NSW males. Qualifying being held from 27-29 June 2020 at Casino RSM, East Maitland, Warilla and Merimbula.

Ten NSW males will qualify for the Australian Indoor Singles at Tweed Heads from 17 to 20 August.

Players are able to nominate which of the venues they wish to attend to qualify and will be asked to nominate their preferred day of qualifying. Bowls NSW will make every effort to allocate everyone their preferred date. Players will not have to travel to another venue for subsequent rounds.

Qualifiers will receive some financial assistance towards their costs of travelling to the national finals. while BA provides accommodation and some meals while players are competing at the National finals.



Open and Senior Inter-Zone Sides

Grandviews and Olds Park Bowling Clubs will play host to the cream of the lawn bowls talent from around NSW when they host the 2020 Inter-Zone and Senior Inter-Zone Sides Championships from 10-15 March.

The Championships kick off on Tuesday 10 March with the Senior Sides, featuring the players aged 60 years and over before the Open version players begin their quest to be the supreme Zone on Friday 13 March.


Each of the Championships has a side of 12 players representing each of the 16 Zones from around NSW, bringing almost 500 players and officials into the area and making a massive carnival of bowls.

Tuesday 10 March will see the opening sectional rounds of the Senior Inter-

Zone, Wednesday the 3rd sectional round and quarter-finals. Thursday 12 March has the semi-finals and final of the Senior event. The (open) Inter-Zone opening 2 rounds are played on Friday (13 March), round 3 and quarter finals on Saturday and the semi-finals on Sunday 15 March.

Grandviews is the main host club and will have play each day, while Olds Park will host the sectional rounds and quarter-finals on Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday.

Bowls NSW 5-a-Side

The Bowls NSW 5-a-Side is set to show the best of lawn bowls again this year when some of the best players in the world show their talent at Warilla Bowls & Recreation Club between 23 and 26 March 2020.

The event will feature the Australian Jackaroos sides to compete at the 2020 World Bowls.

Joining the competition in 2020 will also be two sides from Hong Kong as well as the top talent from clubs around NSW.

Warilla will be looking to emulate their 2019 victory.

Other local sides include Dapto

Citizens, Oak Flats and Corrimal while the resurgence of Nowra is reflected in their entry this year.

Top Sydney metropolitan clubs, Cabramatta, St Johns Park, Taren Point, Merrylands and Engadine will also look to make their mark on the event.

Clubs from the Hunter and Newcastle dominated the recent NSW Player Awards and will be keen to perform well in the 5-a-Side, with Raymond Terrace, Kurri Kurri, Windale, Soldiers Point and Charlestown all representing their region while Terrigal will be flying the flag for the Central Coast.

It is also fantastic to see our first non-

Grade 1 composite side involved in 2020. Centred around Gunnedah, the Western Warriors will feature some great bowlers from the State's North West and will be sure to make an impression.

The event features sides of 5 players who play off over 12 rounds – 6 rounds of singles/fours and six rounds of pairs/triples. The best performed sides progress to the finals.

Play gets under way at 8.30am on each day, spectators are encouraged to enjoy the hospitality of Warilla Bowls. Entry is free! (normal club visitor rules apply).
