Oak Flats - 2018 Mixed Bronze Club Challange Champions

The Bowls NSW Board of Directors has resolved that effective 1st October 2019, the requirement to be male in gender to register with Bowls NSW under the Bowls NSW Constitution and Regulations will be removed.

The removal of gender restriction will allow member clubs and affiliated sub-clubs to register persons of any gender as an individual member or Registered Player with Bowls NSW and allow them to compete in Association events.

In 2020, Bowls NSW Association events will be played as open gender, allowing all eligible registered players to enter and compete.

FAOs

Why is Bowls NSW opening its membership?

It is a key objective of Bowls NSW to grow the sport and to act in the best interests of the sport.

Which Bowls NSW events will become open gender?

In 2020, all Bowls NSW Association events will become 'open gender' meaning that any person is able to enter and compete in events (that they are eligible to enter) regardless of gender.

Will female bowlers registered with Bowls NSW still be able to play in Women's Bowls NSW events?

Bowls NSW encourages female bowlers to continue to register and compete in Women's Bowls NSW events where possible in 2020, particularly in pathway events and representative events which will not be offered by Bowls NSW as single gender events.

Will female bowlers be eligible to be selected in representative sides?

As registered members of Bowls NSW, registered female members are eligible to be selected in any Bowls NSW representative side where they meet the selection criteria.

Bowls NSW however, will not be offering a separate female only representative pathway at interzone or interstate level in 2020.


What happens next?

Clubs will be able to submit Application for Registration forms for all genders from 1st October 2019

2019 State Championships



State Singles Champion Matt Baus of Raymond Terrace

Matthew Baus of Raymond Terrace is the 2019 NSW State Singles Champion after a dominant performance in the final at Ettalong Bowling Club.

Baus played fantastic bowls and never let David Ferguson (Engadine) settle into a rhythm, dominating the scoring to run away with the final 31-10.

Baus becomes the first player to have won the trio of NSW State Junior Singles, NSW Champion of Club Champions Singles and NSW State Singles Championship.

The Runner-Up badge was Ferguson's second in three years and the third in a row for Engadine after Ferguson was a finalist in 2017 and Mason Lewis was Runner-up in 2018.

Baus wins 2019 NSW State Singles

The NSW State Senior Singles trophy went to another Newcastle District player after Jack Littlewood got the better of John Roberts from host club Ettalong. Littlewood started strongly before Roberts ignited the hopes of the home fans with a spirited fightback. Littlewood recovered however and powered home to record a 31-18 victory.

Matt Hooker (Austral) got off to a slow start in the final of the State President's Reserve Singles, trailing Geoff Grover (Tigers Five Dock) 0-10. Hooker clawed back to even terms at 19-19 only to see Grover again go ahead 25-19. Hooker then went into overdrive, dominating the closing ends to take the championship with a 31-26 victory.

Cannons defeat Lions in Pairs Final

Aaron Appleby and Nathan Dawson of the Kurri Kurri Cannons are the 2019 NSW State Pairs Champions, claiming victory over Mt Lewis Lions pair Ben Glasson and Nathan Wise in the final at Ettalong.

In the State Senior Pairs Westport's Colin Baldwin and Peter Stockham claimed victory over Michael Beesley and Michael Brown of Beresfield. The Westport lads edged ahead in the middle stages of the final and then maintained control over the lead to take the final 21-13. Baldwin went one better than his performance in the State Senior Triples, where he finished as runner-up just a few days earlier.

In the final of the State President's Reserve Pairs Rick Staats and Warren Hopley from Mounties (Mt Pritchard) forged ahead in the opening stages before a spirited fightback from Matt Fyfe and Graham Hill of Lake Cargelligo saw them fight back to within just two shots. A count of 4 to the Mounties combination blew the difference out to 6 with one end left to play. The task however was too great for the South Western NSW players to overcome and Mounties claimed the Championship with a 20-13 victory.

Open Triples Champions - Josh Berry, Chris Herden and Ben Twist of St Johns Park

The Champions in the Triples discipline have been crowned, the first State Champions determined in the NSW State Championships finals at Ettalong Bowling Club. St Johns Park, Wagga Rules and Cabra Vale Diggers Clubs claiming the honours.

In the State Triples final, the St Johns Park trio of Josh Berry, Chris Herden and Ben Twist set the early pace in the final against Corey Parker, Aaron Appleby and Nathan Dawson of Kurri Kurri. The trio from the Western Sydney club made every post a winner over the opening 14 ends, streaking out to a lead of 18-3. The Kurri combination produced a mini-fightback in the losing stages, however with the score at 24-10 after 23 ends, the result was secured and the players shook hands on St Johns Park claiming the title. The opening stages of the State Senior Triples final saw the Westport combination of Col Baldwin, Richard Lee and Michael Brennan take the advantage. They opened the scoring against Doug Kinder, John Hetherington and Peter Rudd (Wagga Rules) with a count of 5 and then lead 9-1 after 3 ends. The Wolves (Wagga Rules) then fought back to trail 9-10 and then levelled the scores at 14 apiece after 14 ends. Westport again looked to have taken the ascendancy leading 22-15 after 19 ends. The Wagga Rules trio however again fought back to level the scores at 22-22 after 23 ends. The Wolves then closed out the final, scoring singles on both remaining ends to take the championship 24-22.

The State President's Reserve Triples final was also a nail-biting affair.

From there on the Cabra Vale Diggers team of Paul Crossan, Ian Norman and Troy Allard fought hard to stay in touch with Quirindi, gradually closing the gap to trail 22-20 after 21 ends.

A fantastic conversion shot on the 22nd end by Heaver saw Quirindi lead 24-22 with 3 ends to play. Cabra Vale Diggers then stormed back into contention with a count of 4 to level the scores with 2 to play.

Quirindi again seemed to be gaining control on the penultimate end, however Allard disturbed the jack and then out-drew Heaver to lead by a single shot with 1 to play.

The final then came down the last bowl, with Cabra Vale Diggers holding a single shot, surrounded by Quirindi bowls, the conversion attempt just missing to leave the title to go to Cabra Vale Diggers 26-24.


Cougars Claim State Fours

Blues Win Australian Schools Super Series

NSW has retained the Australian Schools Super Series shield after a quality and intense final against Queensland. NSW was represented by 15 Combined High Schools players selected from the NSWCHS Championships at Bateau Bay last month.

Playing in a 5-a-Side format on excellent greens at Tweed Heads, NSW 'Red' qualified for the Sides final against the Queensland U-18 Boys. Finding themselves 7 shots down and time running out, NSW dug deep to secure the shield on the very last bowl.

NSW had a very young and somewhat inexperienced squad, yet continually competed and defeated several U-18 Australian squad members and National Champions. The NSW 'Red' side had two students still only in Year 7.

NSW also won five medals in the individual discipline finals of the Australian Schools Super Series played at Tweed Heads. The NSW 'Blue' side collected two gold medals in the Triples and Fours, NSW 'Green' won the Fours silver medal and NSW 'Red' scored two bronze medals in the Singles and Triples.



Four NSW school players were named in the Australian Merit side selected after the event – Sam Harrison (Billabong High), Mia Hotson (Camden High), Tom Holburn (Nepean CAPA High) and James Robinson (Peak Hill Central School). A further two players were announced in the Australian emerging side – Tom Bowman (Coonabarabran High) and Britt Camp (McIntyre High).

The NSW Club Challenge is an inter-club competition where sides are made up of a singles player, a pairs team and triples team. There are three men's divisions, two women's divisions and two mixed divisions catering for all skill levels.

The best performed sides will go on to play off to reach the State finals series, which will be held at Warilla Bowls & Recreation Club and surrounding venues on 7 and 8 December.
