

2019 World Cup Champions Crowned

Irish international **Gary Kelly** and New Zealand superstar **Jo Edwards** were crowned as World Cup Indoor Singles champions in Australia at the Warilla Bowls & Recreation Club.

In his first tournament start at the mega club's indoor stadium Kelly triumphed in his World Cup debut, while Edwards claimed an unprecedented sixth championship.

Kelly, who is currently calling Warilla home, defeated clubmate Brendan Aquilina, who represented Malta with distinction over the nine days of competition. Both were undefeated coming into the main event, having dropped just one set apiece from their 11 qualifying rounds.

It was Aquilina who ended local hopes of a seventh victory from resident pro Jeremy Henry with a straight sets semi final win.

Of the 15 World Cups competed since 2005, no fewer than eight have been won by players of Irish descent, with James Talbot in 2011, Henry's six in 2012, '13, '14, '16, '17, '18 and now Gary Kelly with his 11-4 9-3 scoreline.

Edwards, the reigning Commonwealth Games singles gold medalist reaffirmed her mantle as the most successful female competitor in bowls history when she claimed the women's title. She joined Jeremy Henry as a six-times



winner of this event, having previously won in 2009, '10, '11, '13 and 2017, plus, in the process Edwards won her 13th 'major', two clear of Northern Ireland's legendary Margaret Johnston's eleven.

The rangy Kiwi defeated Guernsey pocket rocket Lucy Beere, the defending champion 8-5 10-5 in the main event. In a repeat of the 2017 final – in which she defeated Beere 8-5 2-9 4-1 – Edwards remained calm under fire as last year's winner made a last ditch charge at a repeat crown. But when the scores sat tied at 5-5 after six ends, Edwards raised the tempo

scoring a single and a pair of twos to capture an unprecedented sixth title.

Illawarra Gorillas Clinch First BPL Trophy



The Illawarra Gorillas have secured the Bowls Premier League trophy for the very first time, after defeating the Brisbane Pirates in a tense tie-break finish.

In what was only the second ever final to go a decider (previous was BPL03), the Kay Moran, Jeremy Henry and Aaron Teys-lead Gorillas pipped the Pirates at the death.

It was the Pirate's third successive after taking out BPL08 on their home turf in Club Pine Rivers last time around, and despite some MVP Alex Marshall magic, they couldn't repeat their heroics.

The Pirates began their night with victory over local rivals the Gold Coast Hawks in the elimination final, while the Gorillas pipped the Roys in the semi final in what was their first of two tie-break victories for the night.

Unfortunately for the Roys, they would go out in straight sets to the Pirates, the same team who knocked them out at the preliminary final stage last time out.

Wheelchair Sports NSW and Bowls NSW Do it Together

In line with our ongoing support of disability bowls in NSW, Bowls NSW will team with Wheelchair Sports NSW by providing financial assistance to the ten bowlers attending the 2019 Multibowl National Championships.

The Multibowl National Championships will be held in Mackay Queensland, at the South Suburban Bowling Club from 19-24 May. This event provides the only National level competition within classification amongst athletes with a disability whilst also representing their State.

Pat Curtin, Sports Development Officer of Wheelchair Sports NSW says, "It means a lot to the players to know that Bowls NSW has contributed their support and makes them feel less marginalised as a playing group. Bowls NSW's support of the representative team will free up Wheelchair Sports NSW's resources to be used to continue to develop multi-disability bowls throughout NSW through local competitions and development bowls."

Gunnedah's Tim Thorning wins 2019 Zone 3 Junior Championship



The region's best junior lawn bowlers have battled it out at the Zone 3 junior play offs in Manilla.

Competitors from as far as Wee Waa and Walcha hit the greens with Gunnedah's Tim Thorning walking away with the top prize.

After defeating West Tamworth's Kasey Cone in the semi finals Thorning progressed to face off with West Tamworth's Zoe Stewart in the final. Stewart, fresh off the back of her semi-final victory over Armidale's Brittany Camp trailed 12-4 after 11 ends before mounting a comeback to have the scores tied at 21 after 26 ends.

From there, Thorning held his nerve to claim the championship with a 25 to 21 after 27 ends.

Zone 3 junior co-ordinator Ian Bannister said the tournament's games were of top quality.

The competitors will now turn their attention to pennant bowls, which begins this weekend.

Impending Changes to Artificial Devices Policy



Bowls Australia's Board has signalled an impending change to the national Artificial Devices Policy, pertaining specifically to the use of bowlers arms.

The revised Artificial Devices Policy, which will come into effect from May 1, 2019, has removed the existing stipulation that players need to have received approval from the State/Territory Association to use a bowlers arm, and also removes the need for a medical certificate to use a bowlers arm.

The changes to the policy come after extensive consultation and feedback from key stakeholders.

It is envisaged that the leniency will result in greater opportunity for persons with physical restrictions and impairments to continue playing the sport, and is in line with the policies of other national bodies.

Further to the changes, Bowls Australia wishes to clarify the procedure to request replacement National Merchandising Program (NMP) logo stickers for approved bowlers' arms

In the event that an approved bowlers' arm's existing National Merchandising Program (NMP) logo sticker has come off due to

wear and tear over time, Bowls Australia may be contacted to request a replacement sticker be posted out, to then affix to the arm.

Players will need to provide details of their arm (ideally a photo) so that BA can confirm that the device is indeed an approved bowlers arm, which can be done by post or email to admin@bowls.com.au.
