NSW Government Grassroots Sport Fund

The Grassroots Sport Fund will provide a one-off grant of up to \$1,000 to around 12,500 eligible local clubs and associations across the State to assist them with recovery from the impacts of COVID-19 and the recommencement of community sport.

Action starts with the Women's State Pennant Finals taking place at Forster Bowling Club and Sporties Tuncurry. Grades 1 and 3 kick things off from 18-20 March, followed immediately by Grades 2 and 4 who play from 21 - 23 March.

Commencing right after will be the Grades 1 - 7 Open Gender State Pennant Finals held at various bowling clubs across New South Wales. Entry into all of these events is free, and for those who can't make it to clubs, matches across

the Women's State Pennant Finals and the Grade 1 Open Gender State Pennant Finals will be live streamed through the Bowls NSW Facebook page. A detailed schedule of live streamed matches will be published closer to the event date.

While many would hate the early starts or seasonal pressures of being a greenkeeper, as an avid surfer, Neil couldn't have found a more fitting career.

"I've always loved surfing and growing up in Balmain I'd do anything to knock off early and go surfing. I just love being near the beach and love the atmosphere," explained Neil.

"The highlight of my career has been mixing with the members and having the opportunity to play bowls at the Club. I have played Championships for 10 to 15 years and really enjoyed it.

"I guess it's nice to also enjoy the greens when you're not on the clock," he laughed.

Over the almost four decades of calling the Central Coast home, Neil and his family have enjoyed living in Wamberal, where retirement offers the opportunity for more family time,

sleep-ins and perhaps more swings on the golf course.

"I have two beautiful daughters and four grandchildren and am looking forward to spending time with them and of course surfing and playing golf more.

While he may be leaving his garden tools in the shed, Neil says it's not goodbye to the Bowlo as he has made some wonderful friends from his time there.

Tommy Turns 100 After a Lifetime of Service

A KINGSCLIFF man who jumped out of an airplane at age 95 and is turning l00 years old said the secret to his long life is a positive attitude and the love of family and a good laugh.

Tommy Grimes was born in Nambour, Queensland, in 1922, before moving to Kingscliff in 1966 to raise his three children with his wife.

"We used to come on holidays and I'd go fishing at South Beach," Tommy said. "We used to walk across the river because there was no bridge. We loved the place and ended up buying a five acre block of land for \$21,000 near the current police station." Tommy ran Kingscliff Gas Service for 25 years and provided free services to locals and organisations when he retired.

He has dedicated much of his life to volunteer work and community service, "motivated by his selfless nature and his desire to help others," according to daughter Heather.

Tommy completed Civilian War

Service from 1941 to 1945 and was a Kingscliff Rotary Club charter member when it began in 1970.

"I liked the community projects we did for local youth; I was on the District Youth Committee for six years," he said.

"I got the Paul Harris Fellow Award in 1987 which is the highest award you can get in Rotary."

Inspired by a visit to Reverend Ted Noffs, Tommy played a key role in developing Life Education, a drug and alcohol education program for young people and their families.

"They got Ted in to sort out some of the people at Kings Cross and he couldn't do anything with them, but he decided he could help out the young people." Tommy said.

Tommy went on to start the first ever mobile Life Education classroom which he drove around NSW and Queensland.

Tommy was a SES member from 1970 to 1988, played tennis at Kingscliff Tennis Club for many years and is still bowling at the Cudgen Leagues Bowling Club. "Someone asked me what I wanted for my 95th birthday and I said, I'd like to jump out of an airplane, so the Rotary Club went ahead and organised it," he said.

'Two of the Rotarians, two females came with me and it was lovely; it was an experience."

Tommy lives with daughter Heather and her husband in the house he used to own in Kingscliff Street and says the secret to a long life is staying active and having a positive attitude.

"You keep your mind and body active," he said.

Heather said the only medication Tommy takes is for low blood pressure and apart from that he has always been healthy.

"He loves a laugh as well and that helps keep him young."
