NSW v QLD Test Series Results Decided As Wet Weather Wreaks Havoc



Wet weather has led to a decision being made to abandon the Third Test in the series between the KENO NSW Blues and Queensland, with conditions too difficult to continue play.

The first two Tests were able to be completed yesterday afternoon and this morning respectively, with all players putting on a show for the strong crowds at Taren Point Bowling Club. As the Third Test got under way

in the afternoon, the bad weather hit and despite multiple attempts to get back out on the green, the matches were eventually called off.










Sam Laguzza Retires From State Representative Bowls

Laguzza officially Sam has announced his retirement from State representative bowls, effective immediately. A certified living legend of bowls within New South Wales, Sam finishes his representative career with 322 appearances for the KENO NSW Blues, placing him third on the men's all-time list of representative matches played. In addition to these caps, Sam has also represented the KENO NSW Senior Blues on 38 occasions since making his debut in October 2005.

Sam saw this moment as the ideal time to step down from State representative duties, noting the abundance of quality players coming through the senior ranks. At 82-years-old, he leaves behind a lasting legacy of competitiveness and commitment that will inspire bowlers of all ages for years to come.

"I've really enjoyed my time playing for New South Wales, from my Open side debut back in 1985 right through to playing with the KENO NSW Senior Blues. I love the competition that State bowls provides, and I will look back fondly on all the memories I have taken from my time playing for the mighty Blues."

Some of Sam's career highlights include playing with the likes of Darby Ross, John Snell and long-time friend Troy Somerville. When asked if he had a favourite memory, it was undoubtedly winning the 1995 Alley Shield held at Cabramatta, where he was able to share the victory with his son Tony Laguzza who was also in the side.

Despite calling time on representative bowls, Sam has no intention of giving the sport away. In fact, he's



already organising roll-ups at his club Charlestown to help out younger and newer bowlers. "I still love the game, and I'll continue giving back to others as much as I can."

Bowls NSW Chair of Selectors Peter Hughes was full of praise for Sam upon hearing of his retirement. "Considering all that Sam has done at the age he is, it's incredible. In particular, his selection in the inaugural Australian Senior Jackaroos Side in 2019 at the age of 79 shows just how impressive he is as a player. Sam has been the benchmark for senior bowlers in recent years, and he will forever be remembered as a competitor, and a great bloke too."

With the Australian Sides Championships coming October, Sam was quick to wish all KENO NSW Blues sides the best of luck and encouraged everyone to play well and most importantly to support each other. "For all that I've achieved playing for New South Wales. I couldn't have done it without the support of my teammates. That's what bowls is all about, and what makes playing for the Blues so

- 32 teams to make it through qualifying into the State Finals
- Entrants no longer need to be from the same club, meaning you can enter a mixed pairs team into qualifying with anyone from any club in NSW

How to Enter through BowlsLink

- Log in to your Bowlslink account
- Click on 'Competitions' then 'Available'
- In the search field, type NSW then press enter
- Scroll down to find 2022 2023 Bowls NSW State Mixed Pairs Qualifying and click on the action button (right of screen) then enter competition
- Your details will appear on screen just select your playing position then save then click on Add Player
- MAKE SURE YOU HAVE the National Identity Number (NIN) of your playing partner (if you or they do not know, ask them to see their club administrator to obtain their number)
- Click on link member and type in the NIN then click search
- The system will find the player then click select
- Their details will appear on screen just select their playing position then click save then click next
- From the dropdown list select the region you want to play your qualifying matches in then click next and then next again
- Agree to the Terms & Conditions and click next then enter your payment details and confirm
