NSW representatives Carl Healey and Ben Twist teamed up with Barrie Lester (QLD) to win silver in the Men's Triples discipline, narrowly defeated by England in the final.

In the Women's Singles, our own Ellen Ryan has created history becoming

the first Australian woman to win the event and the first Australian lawn bowler to win Commonwealth Games gold in the UK.

NSW Bowling Clubs Secure Infrastructure Grants



Four NSW bowling clubs have been announced as successful applicants for the NSW Government's Clubgrants Category 3 Infrastructure Grants. The purpose of the funding is to support projects that involve the

building, renovation and fit-out of community infrastructure.

Stockton, Warners Bay, Goodooga and Campsie South Bowling Clubs will all receive funding for projects totalling \$628,000 which will undoubtedly go a long way in supporting the local bowling members and broader communities. The allocation of funding and project descriptions are outlined below:

| Club | Project Description | Funding Received |
|---|---|------------------|
| Stockton Bowling Club | Upgrade of the Clubhouse facilities | \$225,000 |
| Warners Bay Sports Club | Replacement of the outdoor entertainment lighting and seating | \$50,000 |
| Goodooga Bowling Club | Upgrade of the Goodooga Bowling Club | \$300,000 |
| Campsie South Bowling & Recreation Club | Construction of an all-weather shelter | \$53,000 |

Applications for the next round of Clubgrants Category 3 funding opens on 10 October 2022. If your club is interested in applying for a Grant, contact your local Regional Bowls Manager (RBM) for assistance!









State Mixed Pairs Qualifying ENTRIES OPEN



Exciting changes have been made to the 2022-23 State Mixed Pairs Championship, making the competition bigger and better than ever!

Entrants no longer need to be from the same club, meaning you can enter a mixed pairs team into qualifying with anyone from any club in NSW. In further good news, Bowls NSW is doubling the number of qualifiers that make it through to the 2022-23 State Championships. Thirty-two (32) teams will make it through qualifying, which will take place in every regional area of the State from 5th – 6th November 2022.

Qualifying will be conducted through sectional play, guaranteeing every team will play at least two matches. Entry into the competition is only \$52 per team, and gives you the chance to compete for a State title and the possibility of playing in the Australian Championships in 2023!
