Bowls NSW would like to provide an update to members on the current activity within Bowls NSW.

Firstly, we apologise for the delay in announcing the 2022-23 Single Gender State Pennant Finals venues.

The immediate focus of the Board is on the recruitment of a new CEO. The Board will share updates with members as they become available. The time is also right for the two director positions to be filled, and an EOI has been published to that effect.

The Board is also working with staff to develop the Operational Plan

to coincide with the Bowls NSW Strategic Plan which will be released to members by 15th November 2022.

Our talented staff members are continuing to work hard, running the day-to-day operations of the sport within New South Wales. A major priority currently being worked through by staff is improving the reach of Bowls NSW direct communications to members.

Staff members are also focused on the following:

Preparing an information

- package to be available for clubs wanting to unify at club level;
- Making the access to BowlsLink training easier and more readily available across NSW;
- Making arrangements for the Single Gender State Pennant Finals and the KENO Blues Sides to represent NSW at the Nationals;
- Finalising the Annual Report and preparing for the AGM;
- Preparing for the State O40s pairs Finals;
- Preparing for the State Mixed Pairs Qualifying and State Rookies Qualifying
- The Bowls NSW Club Conference initially scheduled for October this year has been moved to early 2023, with a confirmed date to be announced shortly.

Bowls NSW will continue to keep members informed about any changes in our office as well as new and other focus areas as further updates become available.

Qualifying Dates

Pairs: 26 - 27 Nov 2022 Singles: 10 - 11 Dec 2022

- Qualifying will take place at a designated venue within each of the sixteen Bowls NSW Zone boundaries. Names of the specific host clubs will be provided in due course.
- Entries close on the 31st October 2022.
- To be eligible as a Rookie for the 2022/23 events, you must have joined a bowling club after 1st April 2018.
- Entries are open to male and female bowlers. Pairs teams are not required to be from the same club, although they are required to be from the same zone boundries.
- Entry fee Singles \$26 / Pairs \$52 (per team)

How to Enter through BowlsLink

- Login to your BowlsLink account
- Click on 'Competitions' then 'Available'
- In the search field, type NSW then press enter
- Scroll down to find the Rookie event you wish to enter (Singles and/or Pairs) and click on the action button (right of screen), then enter competition
- Your details will appear on screen just select your playing position then save then click on Add Player
- MAKE SURE YOU HAVE the National Identity Number (NIN) of your playing partner for the pairs competition (if you do not know, ask your club administrator to obtain their number)
- Click on link member and type in the NIN, then click search
- The system will find the player, then click select
- Their details will appear on screen just select their playing position then click save then click next
- From the dropdown list, select the zone your club is within then click next and then next again
- Agree to the Terms & Conditions and click next. Finally, enter your payment details and confirm



Regional Bowls Manager - Northern and Western NSW

Bowls Australia (BA) is the national sporting organisation responsible for the leadership, development and management of Bowls in Australia. There are over 1,800 clubs and over 690,000 participants nationwide. BA is affiliated with World Bowls and the Australian Commonwealth Games Association where it is a core sport in the Commonwealth Games held every four years.

As a member of the Bowls Australia Bowls Operations Team this position will provide direct assistance to Clubs to increase sustainability of the delivery network and grow the game of bowls. This includes areas such as:

- Business and strategic planning.
- Member and participant recruitment / retention.
- Funding and grants.
- Program development and delivery.
- Information technology.
- Volunteer strategies.

The Regional Bowls Manager is the on the ground liaison with Bowls Clubs, Regions / Zones / Districts and Local Government Authorities, therefore the role involves a significant amount of travel. Help KENO Build A Stronger Partnership With Your Club



Keno wants to hear what its NSW bowls club partners think about Keno to better understand how venues view their relationship and become a more strategic partner.

Keno will be sending out its 2022 Pulse Survey during September and invites your team to share your thoughts.

An email will be sent to clubs with a link to the survey. Responses can be anonymous unless your venue chooses to identify itself.

"While our past results are encouraging, Keno is committed to

continually improving on previous results and enhancing our offerings to our partners during 2022. We look forward to your team sharing their insights with us," says General Manager for Keno's Licensed Venue Operations, Paul Malek.

Over the past four years, Keno has significantly improved its relationships and advocacy across the board: its Net Promoter Score increased from +5 in 2018 to +33 in 2021.

The 2021 survey revealed that the strength of Keno's relationships

remains robust, and while COVID-19 significantly impacted the ability to grow them, 47% of venues are promoters of Keno.

In addition, 43% of venues said they feel like they have a partnership with Keno. The growing strength of partnerships is supported by 7% more venues viewing Keno as strategic or business partner since 2018.
