

Wendy Clarke from Ballina was crowned State Senior Women's Singles Champion




Women's Pairs




Men's Senior Triples





Bondi Bowling Club Embracing Change and Inclusivity

After a 17 year hiatus, Bondi Bowling Club recently hosted its women's major singles final, where Georgia Pettit emerged victorious against Olivia Miller in a fiercely contested 25-up match. Prior to this event, the last women's final took place years ago, marked by V. Wedlock's win in 2006 (mother of current Jackaroo Corey Wedlock).

Reflecting on her journey, Georgia, who also serves as the General Manager of the club, shared her early introduction to bowls during her childhood days at Club Heathcote,

"I was first introduced to bowls as a kid at Club Heathcote on a Tuesday night playing indoors with my Grandfather and his friends. As fate would have it years later I now run Bondi Bowling Club and thought it only fitting to join the team. I like that there is more to the game than just physical ability, anyone can join and get involved."

The club is actively working to enhance its women's membership by improving facilities such as upgrading changing rooms and acquiring smaller bowls to facilitate newcomers. These efforts aim to foster a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere. Bondi Bowlo has experienced remarkable а resurgence in recent vears. witnessing a doubling of playing membership and clinching its first Zone flag in 12 years in 2023 (Grade 6).

With an average member age of around 42, it stands out as one of the youngest clubs in Australia, setting the stage for a promising future ahead.
