The Champion of Club Champions Pairs reached its thrilling conclusion on Friday, May 3rd, with Jamie-Lee Worsnop and Ellen Fife of Cabramatta securing the women's title, while Ettalong's Hemi Palmer and Darren Morrison emerged victorious in the men's category.

Cabramatta's dynamic duo maintained their impressive performance in this year's championships, overpowering South Tamworth's Carol White and

Christine Myers with a commanding scoreline of 25-13 in the final.

Worsnop and Fife dominated from the outset, establishing a formidable lead and maintaining their momentum throughout the match. It's important to acknowledge the commendable efforts of White and Myers, who never gave up and despite their best efforts, the gap proved too difficult to overcome.

Meanwhile, in the men's competition, Taren Point's Kyle Hansen and Ray Pearse faced off against Ettalong's Hemi Palmer and Darren Morrison in a hard-fought final.

In the highly anticipated final, the online audience, spanning from local supporters to viewers afar, witnessed an exhilarating showdown that kept everyone on the edge of their seats.

Taren Point surged ahead with a commanding start, taking a 7-1 lead early on. However, Ettalong swiftly rallied, showcasing their skill and determination to level the score after 11 ends. As the match progressed, Ettalong gained momentum, winning five of the next seven ends to establish a four-shot lead, putting pressure on Taren Point.



## **Top 5 Locked In For Finals**



The dust has settled on the Platinum Pennant regular season with the Top 5 sides confirmed for the Finals Series. With all the discussion heading into the final weekend about the possibilities of who could overtake who into the Top 5, it came as a surprise to this Platinum Pennant fan (but possibly no one else) that each team from first to fifth won their Round 10 matches, all but securing the Top 5 with one round to spare.

Heavy hitters Raymond Terrace recorded a monster 41-shot win over Belrose 79 – 38 (10pts – 0pts), as did Mt Lewis defeating Wenty Leagues 66 – 37 (9.5pts – 0.5pts). Cabramatta also secured a maximum 10 points from their clash with Engadine, although with a far tighter scoreline of 56 – 46. The 56 shots secured by the Bullants was the equal-second lowest winning score this Platinum Pennant, just above the 55 shots Raymond Terrace accrued in their Round 4 win over Carlingford.

Joining these teams in the winner's circle were St Johns Park, Taren Point and Warilla, who scraped past Merrylands 60 – 59 (9pts – 1pt), putting an end to the Magic's push for the finals in the process.

While the Top 5 was confirmed at the start of Round 11, the all-important final placings were still up for grabs. Cabramatta needed a win to ensure top spot and the Platinum Pennant minor premiership, and that's exactly what they did beating the Merrylands

Magic 64 – 44 (9pts – 1pt). Hot on their heels were Raymond Terrace who defeated Mt Lewis 67 – 52 (9pts – 1pt), and despite not claiming top spot managed to finish the regular season in second place with an impressive nine wins from eleven rounds.

Warilla secured third place and a crucial second chance at winning the Platinum Pennant with their win over Taren Point, denying St Johns Park the opportunity to jump them into the Top 3 despite their 69-45 (9pts -1pt) victory over East Maitland.

On the other side of the ladder Carlingford snapped their 10-match losing streak by the narrowest of margins, getting the better of the Belrose Bulls 56-55 (8pts -2pts). A 20-12 rink win for Darren Burnett enough to hold the masterboard for the Koalas and lift them off the

bottom of the ladder, overtaking Belrose by a single point.

Players will now enjoy a well-earned weekend off before preparing for the inaugural Finals Series at Warilla Bowling & Recreation Club from 17 – 19 May. Minor Premiers Cabramatta will enjoy a direct route to the Major-Semi Final where they await the winner of Raymond Terrace and Warilla in the Qualifying Final. The loser of that match will play the winner of the Elimination Final between St Johns Park and Mt Lewis, with this match live streamed on Friday 17th May from 6pm.

With five teams left, it's anyone's guess as to who takes out the Platinum Pennant. What can be guaranteed is six world class matches taking place at Warilla for the Finals Series – see you there!

## 2024-25 Conditions Of Play Document Released



Bowls NSW is pleased to present the Conditions of Play document for the 2024-25 season. The State Match Committee have worked tirelessly with our Sport Department to fine tune the contents of this document, and have them ready for publication.

Feedback received from our membership in the 2023 Sport Survey have helped shape the Conditions of Play for the upcoming season.

We are pleased to introduce an Inter-Region competition for Women in the new season, to go along with the already successful Men's Open and Senior representative events.

There has also been some changes in player gradings in the Pennant

competitions to make the process for Club and Region administrators easier to understand, as well as reducing the number of player regrades and post-sectional eligibility waivers required.

The Restriction of Movement of players has been amended in response to overwhelming feedback from our players and officials.

The Platinum Pennant Conditions of Play will be advertised following a review of Season 1.

## **Keeping Things Crystal Clear**

#### **QUESTION OF LAW:**

Playing a Major Singles Championship, one of the Competitors bowls splits apart.

Another bowler on a Neighboring rink playing a social game offers the competitor to use one of his spare bowls. The Championship continues with the Competitor using 3 bowls from 1 set of Bowls and 1 Bowl from another set. Should this have been allowed to happen?

#### **Definition:**

D3 - Set of 4 Bowls all of which are

D3.1 of a Matched set

#### Laws:

#### Law 31 - Damaged Bowls

31.1 - If a bowl is damages during the course of play, the umpire must decide if a replacement bowl is needed

**31.2** - If a bowl that has been struck by another bowl during the course of play splits into pieces, the end must be declared dead

31.3 - In the circumstances described in laws 31.1 & 31.2, the damaged bowl must be replaced

by another bowl from the same set before the start of the next or replayed end as appropriate.

**31.4** - If a bowl at rest in the rink of play spits into pieces without having been struck by another bowl, the bowl must be replaced by another bowl from the same set and the end continued.

31.5 - If a damaged bowl cannot be replaced by a bowl from the same set, all bowls in the damaged set must be replaced with bowls from a different set.

#### Law: 33 - Game Stoppages

**33.1** - If a game is stopped because of darkness, weather conditions or any other valid reason

by:

**33.1.1** - The Controlling Body (or authorised person in the absence of the controlling body)

**33.1.2** The Umpire after an appeal has been made by the players: or

**33.1.3** agreement between the players when an umpire or a representative of the controlling body is not present.

#### Answer:

No,

Law 31 should be applied and if unable to immediately replace the set of Bowls then Law 33 allows for the game to be stopped and continued either later that day or on a different day.

#### **UMPIRE MOBILITY**

Please be aware that it is imperative for an Umpire to be able to kneel down to be able to make sure that they are confident that they are making an accurate measurement. You cannot make an accurate measure particularly when using Calipers or feeler gauges just by leaning over.

Anyone who is applying to be accredited or re-accredited must be able to get down on their knees. It is allowed to use the aid of a walking stick with flange to assist to get up and down. but they must be able to move around to do more than 1 measure jack to Bowl. If they are unable to do this then unfortunately they cannot be accredited as an Umpire.
