The NSW Junior Blues emerged victorious at the 2024 Junior Tri Series winning both the Overall series and the Girls series, held at Club Tweed. Competing against strong teams from Queensland and Victoria, our Boys side finished a close second on the ladder. just six points shy of Victoria.

Sponsored proudly by Cabramatta Bowls Club, the NSW Junior Blues showcased their talent with eight boys and eight girls competing in six rounds of fours, pairs, triples & singles. The competition kicked off with a strong start for the Blues in the opening round of fours, where our sides won three out of four matches. In the second round, our girls' pairs won two out of four matches, while the boys secured one win.

Round 3 featured two rinks of triples and two singles for both boys and girls. The girls excelled in the triples, winning both matches, though they faced tough competition in the singles. Notably, Travis Moran, fresh off his victory at the Junior Nugget, secured a strong win in his singles match for the boys.

Keeping things Crystal Clear

Question of Law:

During one of the rounds of the recent Champion-of-Champions Pairs, a heavy rainstorm struck about mid-game and all players scrambled for cover. The storm lasted for more than 20 minutes, by which time all the competitors were gathered in the Clubhouse and waiting for the game to be continued. Prior to resumption of the game, the Controlling Body announced that all incomplete ends were to be declared dead and, therefore, to be played again.

As the players returned to the green, one approached the Umpire and introduced himself as a Skip and said that he was aware of the Controlling Body's declaration, but at the time the competitors abandoned his rink to shelter from the rain, all bowls had been delivered for that end. Could they now examine the head and declare the shots.

At this point in the conversation, the opposing Skip joined the discussion. The Umpire asked the two Skips whether, in their opinion, the head was as they left it or if that particularly heavy storm might have caused some movement/displacement of the bowls or jack, either by falling over or by wind movement and the Head might have changed. The Skips looked uncertainly at each other and did not offer an answer. So, the Umpire put to them that if they were both in agreement about inspecting and declaring the head, he would allow it. The Skips looked at each other and the 1st Skip said that he wanted to inspect and declare the head. The other Skip disagreed and wanted the end restarted in accordance with the call of the Controlling Body. The Umpire then ruled that as they were not in agreement, the end would



have to be restarted.

Laws:

Introduction:

No laws governing a sport can cope with every situation, and the laws governing the sport of bowls are no exception. Unusual situations not covered within the laws can often arise

The Laws of the Sport of Bowls ('the laws') have been drawn up in the spirit of true sportsmanship. So, if a situation arises that is not covered by these laws, players, markers and umpires must use their common sense and a spirit of fair play to decide on the appropriate course of action.

Law 33 Game stoppages

33.1 If a game is stopped because of darkness, weather conditions or any other valid reason by:

33.1.1 the Controlling Body (or authorised person in the absence of

the Controlling Body);

33.1.2 the umpire after an appeal has been made by the players; or

33.1.3 agreement between the players when an umpire or a representative of the Controlling Body is not present;

the game must be continued either on the same day or on a different day. The scores will be as they were when the game was stopped.

33.2 If an end has started but all the required bowls have not been played, it must be declared dead. (The end must be declared dead even if one or more players choose to remain on the green during the stoppage.)

33.3 If all the required bowls in an end have been played but the process of deciding the number of shots scored (as described in law 23) has not been completed, the number of shots scored must be decided before the game stops.

Keeping things Crystal Clear



Answer:

If a game is stopped because of the circumstances described in this situation, then all participants must leave the green and law 33.2 applies. On one rink all bowls had been played, however, the process of deciding the numbers of shots scored had not started, in that case law 33.3 would apply. However, the Umpire using comonsense and a sense of fair play, as per the Introduction, gave the two skips the choice which, as described in the circumstances, was dependent on both of the skips agreeing. As there was not agreement with the skips, the Umpire made the right choice to rule the end dead and that the end would have to be restarted.

Laser Measures

Laser Measures are becoming a common part of the Umpires Kits throughout Bowling Clubs within NSW. A crucial restriction on all laser measures is that they can only be used when the jack and all bowls are on the green, and nothing is in the ditch. The laws state that any measurement involving the jack or a bowl in the ditch must be carried out using a flexible or string measure whenever possible.

Golding Measure

The State Umpires Committee, have been made aware of Umpires using the Golding Measure at Club and Regional events. The Golding Measure is not currently approved by Bowls Australia.

The State Umpires Committee does realize that a small number of Bowling Clubs do possess the Golding Measure. However, the State Umpires Committee have formally made the decision that, as the Golding Measure is not currently approved by Bowls Australia, that the use of the Golding Measure is not permitted in any and all State and Regional events. The State Umpires Committee also strongly advises that the Golding Measure should not be used in Club events.
