TAB Platinum Pennant

Cougars Lead the Pack After Thrilling Opening Rounds of Platinum Pennant

The 2025 Platinum Pennant is off to a strong start, with Rounds 1, 2 and 3 played over 11-13 April. Clubs brought their A-game right from the outset, with high-quality bowls on display and several close finishes keeping fans on the edge of their seats. Bowls NSW live streamed quality matches from each Round which are available to view on the Bowls NSW YouTube channel.

After the first three rounds, Engadine Cougars have taken an early lead, sitting undefeated at the top of the ladder. Hot on their heels are the Merrylands Magic, who have also impressed with consistent performances. Defending champions Cabramatta Bullants are in third.

Warilla Gorillas and East Maitland Griffins round out the top five, both showing grit and early promise. Wentworth Magpies and Raymond Terrace Jets sit mid-table in sixth and seventh, still well within striking distance of the top spots. Carlingford Koalas, St Johns Park Saints and Mt Lewis Lions are close behind, with plenty of time left to climb the ladder.

At the lower end, Belrose Bulls and Taren Point are still searching for their first win, but with eight rounds to go, there's every opportunity to turn things around.

With the standard of play already sky-high, every round promises to deliver more big moments. Make sure to follow all the action, match replays, and team updates via the TAB Platinum Pennant Hub.

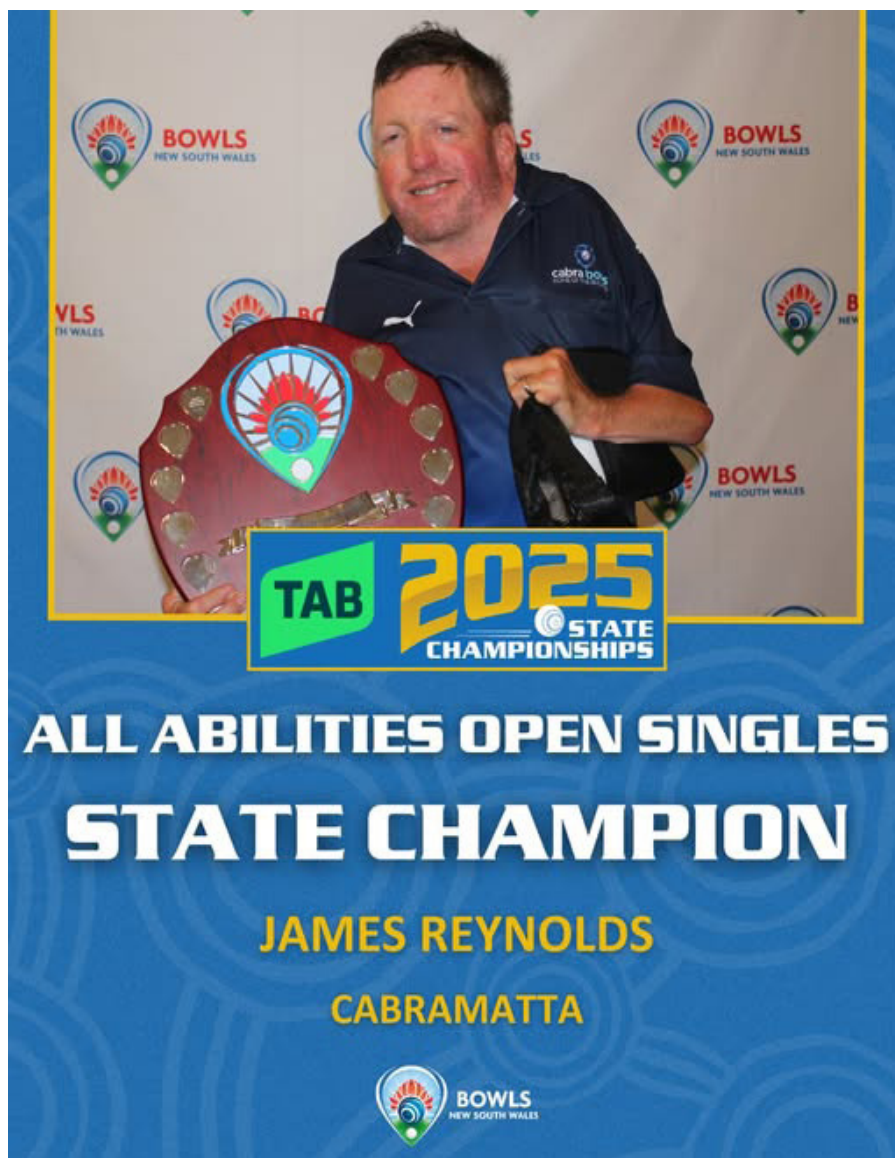
All Abilities Open Singles State Championships

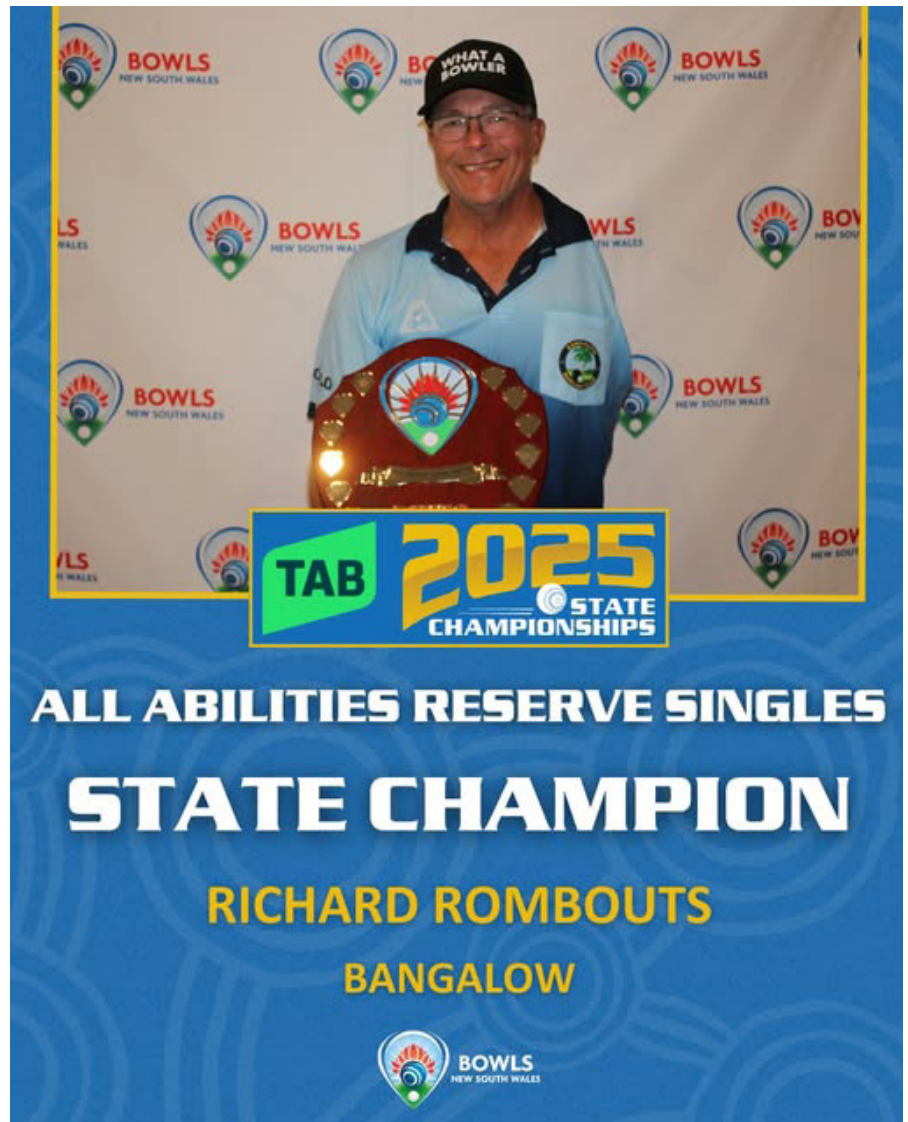
All Abilities Reserve Singles State Championships

The Mixed Pairs competition was a highlight event of the Championships, bringing countless classic matches and tight finishes!

Held at Cherry Street Bowling Club Ballina from March 29 to 31, the event brought together top bowlers from across the state, all vying for championship glory.

In a nail-biting Final, Ben Twist and Brianna Smith from St Johns Park emerged victorious. Heading into the last end they led Kate Morgan and Josh Berry by three shots and looked set to secure a win, when their opposition put together a brilliant end to hold match with one Ben Twist bowl remaining. After removing one shot with his second-last bowl, Twist was staring down defeat, but produced arguably the shot of the championship with a forehand runner that clipped the jack to the corner of the rink, leaving them holding shot and the State Mixed Pairs title. A fitting end to a spectacular match!

Some may argue Twist had good practice for delivering match-winning shots after he produced an equally impressive bowl in the semi-final against Katie Astley and Cody Packer, sitting a bowl out to make 5 shots and secure a 1 shot win.

The finals of the TAB Singles State Championships were played on 6th and 7th April at Cherry St Bowling Club, Ballina, capping off a fantastic 2 days of sectional play.

Cody Packer from Merrylands was crowned the Men's State Champion, while Brianna Smith from St Johns Park took out the Women's title. In the Senior Singles, Warren Shipley (Soldiers Point) and Lynn Briggs (Iluka) claimed the Men's and Women's titles respectively. Joshua Ingram (Australia) was the winner of the Open Reserves Singles.

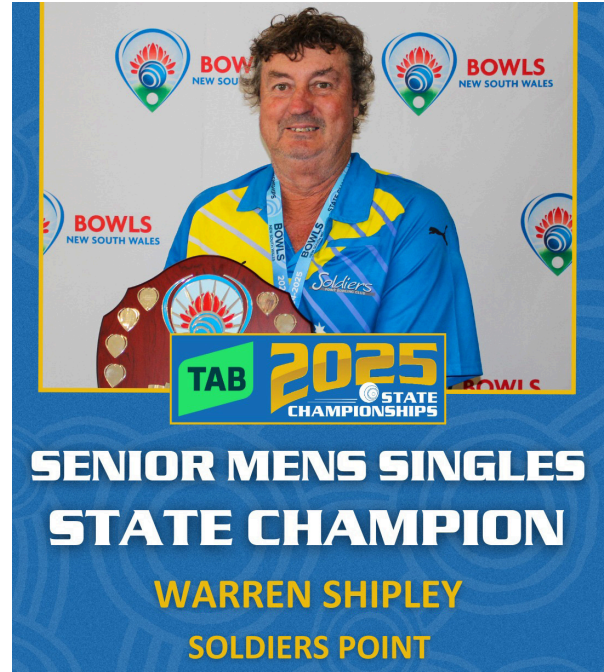
Cody Packer (Merrylands) has etched his name in the Bowls NSW Honour Rolls for the first time, winning the blue-ribbon Men's Singles event. In the semi-final he overcame Darren Morrison (Ettalong) 25-21 and booked a final match-up with fellow KENO NSW Blues rep Ben Twist. Twist had gotten the better of Packer in the Mixed Pairs final earlier in the Championships, but on this occasion it was Packer who proved too consistent, winning 25-8 and claiming the title.



Brianna Smith from St Johns Park continued her outstanding form to claim the Women's Singles State Championship title, adding to her recent success in the State Mixed Pairs. In a strong performance during the final, she faced Sarah Boddington from Forster and secured the win with a convincing 25-12 scoreline.

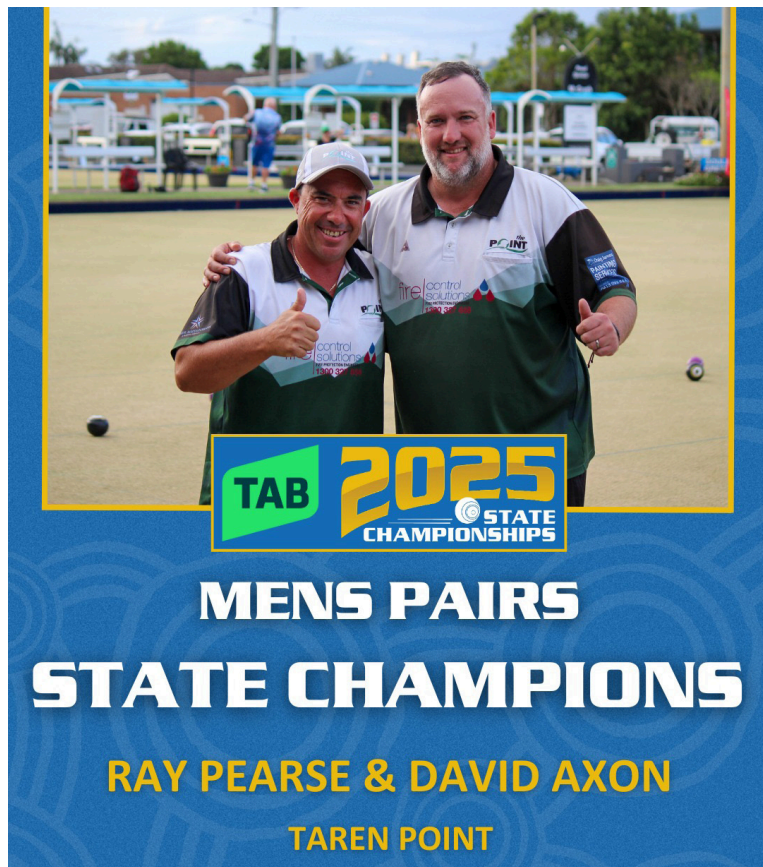
The finals of the TAB Pairs State Championships concluded April 4 at Cherry St Sports.

Ettalong Memorial's Stephen Smith and Philip Westcott secured the Men's Senior Pairs title, and Susan Moore and Christine Keep from Engadine were crowned Women's Senior Pairs champions. In the Open Reserve Pairs, Joshua Ingram and Jordan Mullaney of Austral took out the title. This was an outstanding Championships for Josh who took home the Reserve Singles and Pairs double.

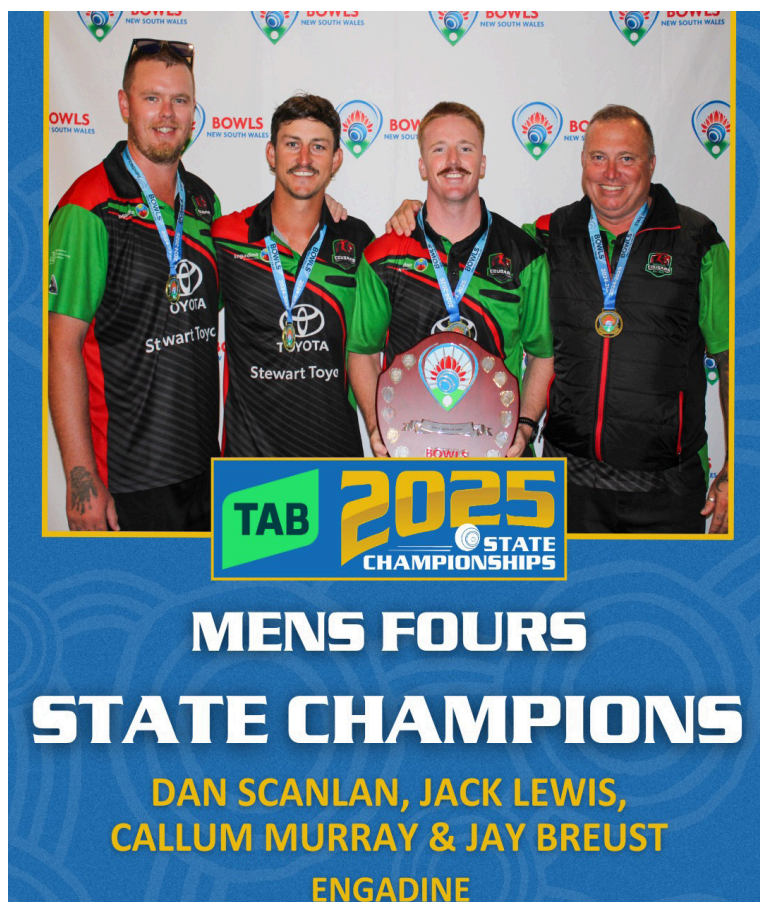

The final day of the 2025 TAB State Championships wrapped up on Tuesday 9 April with the Fours State Championships – a fitting finale to an exciting series of events at Cherry St Sports, Ballina. The Engadine quartet of Dan Scanlan, Jack Lewis, Callum Murray and Jay Breust took out the title, while the star-studded Cabramatta team of Selina Goddard, Jessie Cottell, Jamie-Lee Worsnop and Karen Murphy claimed the Women's crown. Warilla's Vicki Turner, Julea Morgan, Lorraine Alaban and Leone Barnett were victorious in the Senior Women's division, with Club Maitland City's Mark Unicomb, Paul Chapman, Ronald Solomons and Clayton Parker winning the Senior Men's title. In the Open Reserve Fours, the team of Gregory Mitchell, Max Sanbrook, Robert Marshall and Darren Walker from Wagga RSL took home the top honours.

- 5 potential melanomas
- 11 Basal Cell Carcinomas (BCC)
- 4 Squamous Cell Carcinomas (SCC)
- 2 Bowen's Disease

We sincerely thank Scott, Dan and the team at Skin Check Champions for their support and for providing this life saving service to our members. It's a powerful reminder of how important regular skin checks are, especially for those who spend significant time outdoors.

Bowls NSW Seeks Expressions of Interest for Disability Bowls Classifiers and Classification Opportunities



Bowls NSW is seeking expressions of interest from individuals across NSW who may be interested in either becoming classified or becoming a classifier in the disability bowls space.

In 2025, we saw 30 individuals get classified and in doing so they have unlocked competition pathways to events like The All Abilities State Championships. Bowls NSW is in the process of seeking to build its support network in this space by increasing the number of Classified Bowlers in NSW to unlock pathways and develop a network of classifiers so we can continue to drive more participation within our sport.

2025-26 Membership Affiliation Fees

Bowls NSW Membership Affiliation Fees for the 2025-26 Financial Year will increase by 2%. This fee increase is based off expected Bowls NSW expenditure for the 2025-26 financial year.

Next Steps for Clubs

Invoices will be issued to all clubs from 1st July 2025 via email. Clubs are required to pay their affiliation

fees to Bowls NSW by 31st July 2025. Failing to do so will make a club unfinancial, meaning they are unable to participate in any Bowls NSW State events from 1 August onward.

We often receive questions when issuing fees each year, which is why we have prepared Q&A's to assist with some of the immediate queries

or concerns you may have, please see below.



Q&A – Bowls NSW Membership Affiliation Fees

Question 1:

What Does Your Annual Fee Provide?

Answer 1: Your membership delivers significant value, ensuring your club and its members benefit from a wide range of services and opportunities, including:

- Access to Competitions & Pathways – Participate in State events and unlock pathways to National and International competitions.
- Club Support & Resources – Gain access to expert Club Support Managers and dedicated online club support tools through Bowls Australia.
- Administrative, Marketing & Governance Support – Receive direct assistance from Bowls NSW to help your club thrive.
- Exclusive Promotions & Discounts – Take advantage of exciting offers and benefits from Bowls NSW sponsors.

- Live Streaming Coverage – Enjoy free, high-quality live streaming of major bowls events across the State year-round.
- Representative Opportunities – Compete for your club, region, or even your State, embracing the passion and pride that comes with it.
- Sport Growth & Promotion – Benefit from dedicated marketing campaigns designed to attract new players and grow participation in the sport.
- Insurance Coverage – Enjoy coverage under State/Region-administered events.

These are just a few of the many benefits your club receives in return for its annual fee. Your membership ensures the continued success of our sport across NSW.

Question 2: Our Club has experienced some significant challenges and are not confident that we will be able to pay our fees

for the 2025-26 year. What are our options?

Answer 2: If your club has endured significant hardship, we encourage you to read through Section 4.2 of our Regulations and contact our office if you satisfy the criteria. Options available include the possibility of implementing a payment plan to remain financial or requesting direct fee relief. Applications for fee relief must be made from 1 July each year after fees have been issued and will be considered exclusively by Bowls New South Wales. It is not guaranteed that applications for fee relief will be approved.

Question 3: Bowls NSW charges our Club a fixed fee for membership. What does this mean?

Answer 3: This fee can be compared to any other fixed cost for your Club such as a utility fee. The fee is not based off a 'per head' or 'capitation' figure.
